

# Work Abroad with EXPERIENCE INTERNATIONAL

# **OUTBOUND FIRST STEPS**

If you are considering working abroad, Experience International will ask for two documents to get the process started:

### 1. Resume/CV. Please include:

- Biographical Information name, date of birth, phone number, email, home city and state
- Smiling photo in color
- All work experience (family farm, practical training, paid jobs, volunteering) most recent listed first)
  - Company name, start/end dates, hours per week, title, responsibilities, typical tasks
- Education: School name, dates of enrollment and date of degree(s) earned or anticipated
- Special qualification, such as tractor driving or other equipment endorsements/expertise
- Languages: list all languages you can speak conversationally, other than English. Include number
  of years of study and your competency in that language.

# 2. Placement Request/Cover Letter

Some questions to questions to address in your statement should include:

- Why do you want to work/intern abroad?
- Where, and for how long, would you like to work abroad?
- · What kind of position, farm, and living situation would be best for you?
  - Be sure to indicate what agricultural specialty you are best suited for (such as livestock, dairy, or crops) and why.
- · How will you apply this international experience to your future career?
- What are you longer term goals?

Once we receive these two documents from you, we will conduct a personalized search for placements in the industry you request. Keep in mind that some countries might be better suited to offer a placement in a particular industry than others.
